

Ban Chaing Neolithic Pottery Vessle

This ovoid bowl with flared neck is decorated in iron red with parallel scrolls. Includes wrought-iron tripod stand. Ban Chiang is an archeological site in Nong Han District, Udon Thani Province, Thailand. It was added to the UNESCO World Heritage list in 1992. Discovered in 1966, the site attracted enormous publicity due to its attractive red painted pottery. Provenance: I.M.
